The "overseers of the poor" can be defined as local men, appointed to assess the need for, and provide, public assistance to members of the community who could not do so for themselves. Essentially, they implemented local social welfare, before a federal system of relief existed. This system seems to have been pervasive throughout the nation beginning in colonial times and continuing up to the early twentieth century. The men who made up the overseers of the poor were peer elected county officials, who held office for three years and could serve no more than a total of nine years. In order to be eligible for the position, the individual (almost always male) had to be a "freeholder" (someone who possessed land or an estate) and a resident of the said county.

Typically, one overseer would be appointed for each district within the county. Every year, all overseers would come together to discuss the number, names, and situations of the poor, as well as the expenses for their care. Before separate institutions designed for the care of the elderly, "insane" and "feeble-minded" developed, the overseers were responsible for providing for "any inhabitants of the district not able to maintain themselves". Law permitted they provide houses, nurses, doctors, and sustenance to anyone in cases deemed necessary. ¹

While overseers were appointed for counties across the nation, the institution itself was very much a local one. Generalizations should be avoided when speaking of how poor relief was administered and applied. The following transcription of the overseers' of the poor records for the county of Rockingham provides insight into the development, structure, and application of public aid from 1792-1870. However, these documents tell a very specific story, as I have found through my own research. The values, unique environments, and social hierarchies of a community dictate the way in which they interact with and treat the poor. Thus, when considered in a larger context, the following records illustrate far more than the workings of a defunct body, they exemplify how public aid in Rockingham County during the 19th century is a reflection of consistent perceptions of poverty and the impoverished.

The board deeming that some additional building is necessary to the poorhouse and some repair is necessary to the present building it is ordered that Henry Kesling, Jacob Ammon, and Archibald Hopkins be and they hereby are appointed commission to erect or cause to be erected at the poorhouse upon such terms and conditions as they may think proper, a house or houses contains at least 4 rooms with stone or brick chimneys, each room to have a fire place of such size as they may thin will best suit the convenience of the poor, and such place as they may think most conveniently, the said house or house to be built of good oak log well hewed and put together and to be one story high, to be covered with good joint shingles made of oak or good pine, the cracks to be well chinked and doubled with mortar, each room to have a floured with good sound slak above and below with doors and windows such as shall be agreed upon the whole work to be done in a good substantial manner under the direction of the said commission who may make such alterations in the house as they may think proper so as not to increase the expenses, the expenses of said building to be paid for when the work is done and received by the said commission out of any money in the hands of the agent who is hereby directed to pay the sum upon the order of the commission, provided that they are to contract for the payment of said work not be paid for sooner than the 15 of December next- and it is further ordered that the said commission forthwith cause such repairs to be made to the present house on the plan as they shall think required repairs or well add to the convenience of the keeper or to the comfort of the poor persons now there- the expenses whereof to be paid for by the agent in like manner as is directed in the proceeding order and make report of all expenses to the next meeting of the board provided the whole expenses shall not exceed the sum of \$400

An account was presented to the board by Dr. S B Jennings from the overseers of the poor of Page county purporting to be for medical attendance of a woman names Mrs. Nepple who properly belonged to this county and the proceeding of the board of the overseers of said Page county not being regular in the opinion of this board was refused to be acted upon at this time

The board then proceeded to elect an agent and clerk for the board and upon motion John T Harris was unanimously elected agent and clerk for the OS poor of Rockingham County and it is ordered that he given bond with security in the penalty of \$5000

On motion it is ordered that Robert Cox be appointed steward for three years from the 1st day of April 1862 to the poorhouse from the said 1st day April 1862 to the 1st day of the June meeting 1865 the price to be subsequently arranged for the reminder of the term of three years

Ordered that the county court assess a levy of one dollar on each tithable for year ending June 1863

Ordered that Dr Gordon and Williams be appointed physicians to the poorhouse at the compensation of \$60 a year

It is ordered that the agent proceeded by motion against Jos Mauzy and Henry Kisling as sureties for Henry Kisling of Jacob for expenses incurred in supporting Lucy Kisling a slave from April 4 1857

On motion a fine of \$5 is imposed on each committee who may fail to attend quarterly and inspect the poorhouse

The president approved overseers Byerly, Koontz and Funk, said committee

On motion the board adjourned to meet at the poorhouse on Tuesday before the 3rd Monday of June 1863
