

This indenture made the 26th day of June in the year 1813 between Jeremiah Kyle overseer of the poor for the south district in the county of Rockingham of the one part, and John Layman of the same county of the other part, witnesseth that the said overseer of the poor in pursuance of an order of the county court of Rockingham made at the May court law do put and bind Liddey Layman a poor child of E Layman five years old the 18th day of April last past as an apprentice to the said John Layman, with him after the manner of an apprentice to dwell and serve until she shall arrive to the age of eighteen years (to learn the art of spinning, sewing, etc.)

In consideration of which the said John layman binds himself to the said Jeremiah Kyle or his successors in office to teach or cause to be taught and instructed the said Liddy Layman in the art of spinning and sewing during her said term and moreover to find the said apprentice in good and sufficient clothes, meat, drink, and lodging fit and convenient for such apprentice to teach or cause her to be taught to read, write, and common arithmetick including the rule of three and also at the end of her said apprenticeship, shall pay or cause to be paid to her the sum of fifteen dollars.
