Dear Sir:

On or about the date on which we deposited the amount of the awards for the taking of the lands condemned in the above mentioned condemnation proceeding, we filed a number of claims for a distributive share of the awards on various tracts of land based on recorded contracts for Skyline Drive rights of way, and pledges or contributions of lands or money to the Shenandoah National Park projects.

We have collected a substantial number of these claims, but there are still outstanding and unpaid claims, as shown on the attached list.

Will you be good enough to advise us on the enclosed carbon copy of this list, whether the awards have been paid on any of these tracts, and, if so, whether orders for payment of our distributive share were entered at the same time. Also, if any objection has been made by any claimants to the allowance of the distributive share claimed by the State Commission on Conservation and Development, we would appreciate a note indicating the basis of ground of the objection.

P. S. We should greatly appreciate your advising us in any case wherein the owners on the attached list have moved the court for orders on the Treasurer for their distributive share of the award, without at the same time including our claim for payment; as in all such cases it is our purpose to pray the court for permission to be heard on our claims before the entry of any order of distribution in that particular case. Up to this time we ourselves have not moved for orders of payment of our claims because we did not wish to embarrass the owners or to burden them with the necessity for awaiting our attendance at the hearing on their claims in any case in which they themselves raised no objections to our claims. But where objection has been made or where there is reason to anticipate such objection it is our purpose to pray the court for an opportunity to be heard before the entry of orders of distribution of any part of the funds in such cases.
