The jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that Ahas Shifflett, within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully have in his possession ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that Ahas Shifflett, within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully receive ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that Ahas Shifflett, within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully have in his possession a still, still cap, worm, tub, fermenter, and other appliances connected with and used in the operation of a still, without having the same registered as required by law, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of C. D. Fulk and Arthur Shifflett, witnesses sworn in Court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence. *However,*

this prosecution and that the said

that Shifflett be held to hard labor on
the state Convict Road Force for the term
of ~~four~~^{60 days} months, as ascertained by the
verdict of the jury and thereafter until
his said fine and costs be paid, said
additional term, however, for nonpayment
of fine & costs not to exceed four
months. And in accordance with the
statute in such cases made and provided
the Court required of the said Ahaz Shifflett,
a bond, with approved security, in the
penalty of \$3000.00 conditioned that he
shall not violate any of the provisions
of the statutes of Virginia concerning
ardent spirits, commonly known as the
Prohibition Law, for the period of one
year, and if said bond shall not be
executed before the expiration of the
term of imprisonment aforesaid then
said Ahaz Shifflett shall be confined
in jail until said bond is given, or until
he is discharged by the Court, provided
that he shall not be confined in jail
for failure to give said bond for a longer
period than four months. Whenever
the said Ahaz Shifflett is committed to
jail until he can be delivered into
the custody of the Supt. of the State Pen.
to be held as a member of the S. C. P. F.
for the terms & purposes aforesaid.
