in jail for one month and a fine of

WHEREAS there is now in the possession of the Sheriff of this County a quantity of cider, to-wit: About 17 barrels, containing more than 1 per centum alcohol by volume, and it having been established that the accused had been selling, dispensing and giving the same away, contrary to law, and convicted therefor, and no one having appeared making any claim to same, the Court doth declare the same contraband, and as such forfeited to the Commonwealth.

The Court futher orders the same to be turned over to the Attorney General for such action and disposition as he may deem proper as provided by law.

WHEREUPON J. M. Bauserman, Assistant to the Attorney General, appeared before the Court, and requested that said contraband be destroyed by the Sheriff of Rockingham County in the presence of two witnesses in such a manner so that same can not be used in the manufacture of intoxicants or any other purpose; that they make sale of the containers and turn the money received therefor over to the Attorney General, and make report of his action to the next term of this Court; that the Clerk of this Court transmit a copy of said report, along with a copy of this order, to the prohibition department of the State upon adjournment of Court.
