ing affidavits, on the <u>21st</u> day of <u>No.omber</u>, 1933, at ten o'clock A. M., and the said respective objectors, exceptants and movants are granted fifteen days from the date of the entry of this Order within which they may file with the record such additional affidavits in support of their several exceptions, objections and motions as they may be advised: and said Petitioner is granted fifteen days after the expiration of said period, within which it may file with the record such additional affidavits in support of its answer as it may be advised.

It being shown unto the Court that certain of said exceptants, objectors and movants in these proceedings have entered into certain articles of agreement of arbitration with Petitioner, whereby the parties thereto have agreed to submit "any and all questions arising in the course of said proceedings as to damages and values of land and improvements sought to be condemned therein, to arbitration by three or five arbitrators appointed by the Governor from the Circuit Court judges of the state", but that the record does not disclose affirmatively the names of said exceptants, objectors and movants who have subscribed said arbitration agreement; it is ordered that said objectors, exceptants and movants, who have subscribed said arbitration agreement, may disregard the directions of this Order insofar as it applies to the filing of additional affidavits in support of their contentions as to the said questions submitted in arbitration, and insofar as it sets their exceptions, objections and motions for hearing as to said questions, but said exceptants, objectors and movants who have subscribed such arbitration agreements are directed to file with the record a statement in writing setting forth the fact that they have done so.

The Clerk of the Court shall forthwith mail a copy of this Order to each of the said objectors, exceptants and movants whose names are set out in the first paragraph hereof and whose post office addresses are filed with the record, under provision of Section 7 of the Public Park Condemnation Act; and to their respective attorneys of record, to the post office addresses of said attorneys as shown by the record or otherwise known to theClerk; and he shall thereafter file with the record a report setting forth the form and manner in which he shall have complied with this Order.
