In the Circuit Court of said County:

The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the Circuit Court of said county, <sup>at its March term, 1918,</sup> UPON THEIR OATHS PRESENT, that William J. Easton, on the 6th day of February, 1918, in said County, did unlawfully transport, manufacture, sell, offer, keep, store, and expose for sale, give away, dispense, solicit, advertise and receive orders for, ardent spirits, ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> spirits.
