AND THE GRAND JURORS AFORESAID UPON THEIR OATHS AFORESAID, do further present that Heppy Keller within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said county of Rockingham, in the Village of Timberville, did unlawfully get drunk at a public place in the town of Timberville, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Ryman, witnesses sworn in
court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.

Mr. President, I have the honor to submit the following report on the present state of the foreign relations of the United States.

State of Virginia

Rockingham County, to-wit:-

This day before the undersigned Bail Commissioner for Rockingham County, personally appeared, Hupp, Keller sometimes called Hupp, Keller
Benjamin Sutherland Sutherland who jointly and severally acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$500⁰⁰ leviable of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements for the use of the Commonwealth rendered, and as to the payment of which they each waive their Homestead Exemption and any right to discharge any liability arising to the Commonwealth of Virginia under this recognizance by coupons detached from the bonds of this State, the said surety having first justified as to sufficiency, under oath.

Yet upon this condition, that if the said Hupp, Keller shall appear before the Circuit Court of Rockingham County on the 1st day of April 1922, it being the term 1922, at ten o'clock, on the morning of said day, at Harrisonburg, Virginia, to answer the Commonwealth of Virginia concerning a certain Misdemeanor of which he stands charged, and shall not depart therefrom without leave of Court, then this obligation to be void; otherwise to remain of full force and virtue.


