

This indenture Witnesseth that Joseph Cravens one of the overseers of the for Rockingham County pursuant to an order of court held for said county on the day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven hath and doth by these presents put and bind Edith Phillips base born child of Grace Philips of the age of eight years the 25th day of September apprentice to William Loker until she arrives at the age of eighteen years during which term of time the said apprentice her said master shall faithfully serve his secrets keep his lawfull commands every whare gladly obey she shall not damage her said masters goods nor willfully suffer it to be done by others She shall not buy nor sell without leave of her said master nor commit fornication nor contract matrimony nor play at cards dice or any other unlawfull game during the said term nor waist or lend her said masters goods without his leave or consent nor haunt ail houses taverns playhouse nor houses of ill fame but in all things behave herself as a good faithfull honest apprentice aught to do Inconsideration whereof the said William Loker- Doth covenant and agree to provide or procure for the said apprentice good wholesome and sufficient meat drink washing lodging and apparel fitting for such apprentice during the said term and to teach or cause to be taught her the said apprentice to reed wright completely and also to teach the said apprentice the art trade and mistery of spinning on the big and little wheel and niting and sewing compleat and at the expiration of said term to give her twenty dollars for her freedom dues Exclusive of her apparel In witness whereof each party bind themselves to the other and have hereunto set our hands and seals this day of in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven
