

This Indenture MADE THE 1st day of August
in the year of our Lord 1842 Between *Smith Goffland* *Jacob Rohr Sen*

one of the Overseer's of the Poor of the *first* District in the County of Rockingham of the one part, and
Smith Goffland of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of
an Order of the County aforesaid bearing date the 20th day of September in the year 1841 has
placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *Michael Devers* of the age of 12⁵
years to be an Apprentice with him the said *Smith Goffland* and as an Apprentice
with him the said *Smith Goffland* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said
Michael Devers shall arrive, and come to the age of 21 years, according
to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said
Michael Devers shall the said *Smith Goffland*
well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *Michael Devers* shall be put unto
by his said *Master* according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *Michael Devers* and
the said *Smith Goffland* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Smith*
Goffland and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Smith Goffland*
And the said *Smith Goffland* for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby
promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said
Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of *Farmer* which he the said
Smith Goffland now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform,
or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said
Smith Goffland shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel,
washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said
Smith Goffland shall teach, or cause to be taught to the *Michael Devers*
Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *Michael*
Devers the Sum of *Twenty* Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
