against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

AND THE JURORS AFORESAID, UPON THEIR OATHS AFORESAID, DO FURTHER PRESENT, that George Clary on the 22nd day of March, 1918, in said County, did unlawfully transport ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

~~AND THE JURORS AFORESAID, UPON THEIR OATHS AFORESAID, DO FURTHER PRESENT, that George Clary on the 22nd day of March, 1918, in said County, did unlawfully have in his possession at a place other than his home, ardent spirits,~~

WHEREAS, *W. J. Dillard* of the said *City*, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, *J. A. Willis* a Justice of the said *City*, that *George Clary (Colored)* of the said *City*, on the *22nd* day of *March* 191*8*, at

in the said county, did *have in his possession* on one of the streets in said *City*, a place other than his home, certain *ardent spirits*, in violation of Section 65 of the Prohibition law of the State of Virginia

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to *arrest* and bring *mon to appear* before me, or some other Justice of the said *City*, the said

George Clary to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon *to L. Dillard, W. J. R. road - J. G. Myers*

to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.
