

This Indenture made this 25<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year 1813  
between Jeremiah Kyle Overseer of the poor for the South District in the  
County of Rockingham of the one part, and John Layman of the said  
County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Overseer of the poor  
in pursuance of an order of the County Court of Rockingham made  
at May Court last do put and bind Liddy Layman, a poor child  
of E. Layman five years old the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April last past, as an  
apprentice to the said John Layman, with him after the manner  
of an apprentice to dwell and serve, until she shall arrive to the  
age of Eighteen Years, (to learn the art of spinning, sewing &c.)

In consideration of which the said John Layman  
binds himself to the said Jeremiah Kyle or his Successor in Office  
to teach, or cause to be taught and instructed the said Liddy Layman  
in the art of spinning and sewing during her said term, and  
Moreover to find the said apprentice in good and sufficient cloths,  
meat, drink, and lodging fit and convenient for such apprentice  
to teach, or cause her to be taught, to read, write, and common  
arithmetic including the rule of three, and also at the end of  
her said ~~apprentice~~ apprenticeship, shall pay or cause to be paid  
to her the sum of fifteen Dollars, he Witnesseth whereof the said  
Jeremiah Kyle, and John Layman hath hereunto set their hands  
and seals the day and year aforesaid
