Your respondent says that he has never abandoned his car and that at the time evidently referred to in the information he had in his car no ardent spirits whatever; that, if the officer found a small quantity of ardent spirits therein he knows nothing of how it got therein; that the facts with reference to the matter are these:

That, on Saturday night, January 13, 1923, respondent's car was not working properly, and while he was attempting to make some adjustment to the car it ran into a little ditch near the residence of T.A. Rush on the Rockingham and Stanardsville Turnpike a short distance from McGaheysville, Virginia; that, when he got into the little ditch he couldn't get the car out of the same; that he left the car, walked back to McGaheysville and employed a garage man to go after the car; that he and the garage man, upon going to the place where his car had gotten in the ditch, found the same gone; that he ascertained, upon his return to McGaheysville, that the car had been taken possession of by an officer and put in a garage; that, when he left the car, there were no ardent spirits therein, and if any ardent spirits were found therein he had nothing to do whatever with putting the ardent spirits in the car.
