MADE THE

Between

John Bowman

one of the Overseer of the Poor of the

first

District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and

John Fults

of

the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid bearing date the June day of Court in the year 1831 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind W^m H Vanpelt of the age of Twelve years 12th Sept^r years last

to be an Apprentice with him the said John Fults and as an Apprentice with him the said John Fults to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said W^m H Vanpelt shall arrive, and come to the age of twentyone years, according to the Act of the General

Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said W^m H Vanpelt shall the said John Fults

well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said W^m H Vanpelt shall be put unto by his said Master

according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said W^m H Vanpelt and the said W^m Vanpelt honestly and obediently in all things be-

have towards the said John Fults and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said John Fults And the

said John Fults for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the

Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Farmer which

he the said John Fults now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and

informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said John Fults shall also find and allow unto the said

Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said

John Fults shall teach, or cause to be taught to the S^d W^m H Vanpelt Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the

Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said W^m H Vanpelt the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
