MADE THE 26th day of
January in the year of our Lord 1854 Between *Jacob Rohr Sr.*

one of the Overseer's of the Poor of the 6th District in the County of Rockingham
of the one part, and *Henry Pulse* of the other part witnesseth, that the
said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the County Court made at *December*

Court in the year 1853 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and
bind *John Wean* of the age of *12 years & 6 months* to be an
Apprentice with him the said *Henry Pulse* - - - and as an Apprentice with
him the said *Henry Pulse* to dwell from the date of these presents, until
the said *John Wean* shall arrive, and come to the age of *Twenty one*
years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and
during all which time and term the said *John Wean* shall the said

Henry Pulse well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said
John Wean shall be put unto by his said *Master* according
to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *John Wean* - and the said

John Wean honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the
said *Henry Pulse* and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Fam-
ily of him the said *Henry Pulse* And the said *Henry Pulse*

for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with
the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Ap-
prentice shall be instructed in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of *The Farming business*
which he the said *Henry Pulse* now useth, after the best manner that he
can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much
as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said *Henry*



Pulse shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel,
washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term afore-
said: And also that the said *Henry Pulse* - shall teach, or cause to be

taught to the said *John Wean* - Reading, Writing, and Common Arithme-
tic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *John Wean*

the sum of *Fifty dollars & furnish him with a good suit of*
clothes at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.

For and during all which time and term the said John Moore shall the said

well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said John Moore shall be put unto by his said Master according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said John Moore and the said John Moore honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said Henry Dukes and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Henry Dukes And the said John Moore for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being that the said Apprentice shall be instructed in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of the said Henry Dukes which he the said Henry Dukes can, or may teach, instruct and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise apprenticeship, and that the said John Moore shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term above said And also that the said John Moore shall teach, or cause to be

Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic - shall moreover pay to the said John Moore the sum of Ten Pounds per annum for the term of years & years to him with a good duty in the Presence of
