Saft patt at-prentice to George Carr he agreening her for freedom dues fifteen dollars law ful money, to serve him until she arrives at the age of eighteen years, dur ing which Time the said apprentice, her said matter faithfully shall serve, his secrets shall keep, his landul commando every where obey; whe shall do no damage to her said Mafter, nor nertfully nor mother the it to be done by othero; one shall not abboent herself day nor night without her said Matters leave; but in all things behave herself as a good and faithful ver van tor appro-tice ought to do. In consideration where of the said matter shall provide and processe for said appren Tice onfacent meat durink, wathing, lodging, todging & apparel, and leave fitting for such apprentice during the said terin; and teach the said apprentice to read the bible well & write a tolerable hand; In writig where of each partie bind themselves their here and successors firming to the other by thefe presents.
