
Dear Madam and Sirs:

I have considered the application for the pardon of A. T. Crawford, convicted in July, 1927 in the Rockingham Circuit Court of violation of the prohibition law and sentenced to six months in jail, \$5 fine and costs.

This man has served about three and one-half months of his sentence and been an exceptionally good prisoner. The trial officials advise me that this man's wife and family of small children are in a destitute condition and there is no one to provide anything for this family except the prisoner and they are without means of support and under the conditions and the length of time served they recommend a conditional pardon. The Attorney General also recommends the exercise of executive clemency if arrangements are made to pay the fine and costs.

Conditional pardon is being granted upon the condition that should he again violate law his pardon will be null and void and he will have to serve the remainder of his sentence, and upon the further condition that upon his release he is to report to Judge Bertram and make arrangements for the payment of the fine and costs in accordance with Judge Bertram's judgment and if this is not done or he does not carry out the arrangement to the satisfaction of Judge Bertram, I reserve the right to revoke this pardon.
