127 Prohibition law of the State
of Va 1916.

These are therefore, in the name
of the Commonwealth of Virginia,
to Command you to search
the above named room or rooms
and if Ardent Spirits are found
therein. Contrary to law, to
seize said Ardent Spirits and
arrest the person or persons
found in said room or rooms
and bring them together with the
Ardent Spirits so seized, before
me or some other Justice of the
Peace of said City to be further
dealt with according to law.
