

This Indenture made this 15th day of March in the year 1817
Between John Carthage, ^{one of the} overseers of the Poor in the County of Rocking-
ham of the one part and Philip Baker of the said County of the other
part Witnesseth that the said Overseer of the Poor in pursuance of
an order of the County Court of Rockingham made at January
Court 1817 do put and bind Elizabeth Williams of the said County
three years to the 20th day of June Last as an apprentice to the
said Philip Baker with him after the manner of an apprentice
to dwell, and serve him until she arrives at the age of Eighteen
years In consideration of which the said Philip Baker binds
himself to the said John Carthage or his Successors Overseers of the
Poor to teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the
said Elizabeth the art and Mystery of Housewifery during said
Term and moreover to find the said Elizabeth in good and
sufficient Clothes meat Drink washing and Lodging fit and
convenient for such apprentice and teach her Reading and writing
and also at the end of her service shall pay and satisfy unto the
said Elizabeth the sum of Twenty Dollars In Witness whereof
the said John Carthage to the counterpart of these presents hath
set his hand and affixed his seal and the said Philip Baker hath
set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written
