

THIS INDENTURE

MADE THE 25th day of March in the year of our Lord 1836 Between John

F. Effinger one of the Overseer of the Poor of the District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and *Philip Rohr* of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid bearing date the 21st day of March in the year 1836 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *Henry B Lindon* of the age of 9 years the 8th next years to be an Apprentice with him the said *Philip Rohr* and as an Apprentice with him the said *Philip Rohr* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said *Henry B Lindon* shall arrive, and come to the age of *Twentyone* years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said *Henry B Lindon* shall the said *Philip Rohr* well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *Henry B Lindon* shall be put unto by his said *Master* according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *Henry B Lindon* and the said *Henry B Lindon* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Philip Rohr* and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Philip Rohr* And the said *Philip Rohr* for himself *his* Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a *Waggon Maker* which he the said *Philip Rohr* now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said *Philip Rohr* shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the the term aforesaid: And also that the said *Philip Rohr* shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said *Henry B Lindon* Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three and will moreover pay to the said *Henry B Lindon* the Sum of *Twenty* Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
