

This indenture made the twenty third day of July in year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen between John Sellars overseer of the poor of the county of Rockingham of the one part and Jacob Kisling of the said county of the other part witnesseth that the said John Sellar overseer of the poor as aforesaid hath in conformity to an order of the court of the aforesaid county dated March court 1818 hath put placed and bound and by their presents do put place and bind Sally Glass a poor girl whose parents are not able to support to Jacob Kisling the said Sally Glass being eight years old the 31st Day of January last to dwell with him the said Jacob Kisling from the date of these presents until she attains the age of eighteen years according to the act of assembly in that case made and provided and during all which time the said Sally Glass shall the said Jacob Kisling her master well and truly serve in all such lawful business as the said Sally Glass shall be put unto by her said master, according to the power, wit and ability of her the said Sally Glass, and honestly and obediently in all things shall behave herself towards her master, and honestly and obediently towards the family of her said mater, and the said Jacob Kisling shall also find and allow unto her the said Sally Glass sufficient meat drink washing lodging and apparel and all things necessary for an apprentice During the said term as aforesaid, and also shall teach or cause to be taught the said Sally Glass reading and writing and moreover shall pay unto the said Sally Glass at the expiration of her term the sum of twenty dollars.
