

Armstrong, who had in said car at that time about 1 pint of ardent spirits, commonly known as moonshine liquor.

That your informant prays that said automobile be condemned and sold and the proceeds disposed of according to law; that R. H. Armstrong and all other persons concerned in interest be cited to appear and show cause why the property should not be condemned and sold to enforce the forfei ture.
