

THIS INDENTURE

MADE THE

2nd day of March

in the year of our Lord 1829 Between John Bowman

one of the Overseer of the Poor of the

first

District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and

Levy May

of

February

the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid baring date the

22 day of

January

in the year 1829 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Abraham Vance of the age of seven years

to be an Apprentice with him the said Levy May and as an Apprentice with him the said Levy May to dwell from the

date of these presents, until the said Abraham Vance shall arrive, and come to the age of twentyone years, according to the Act of the General

Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said Abraham Vance shall the said Levy May

well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Abraham Vance shall be put unto by his said Levy May

according to the Power Wit and Ability of the said Abraham Vance and the said Abraham Vance honestly and obediently in all things be

have towards the said Levy May and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Levy May And the

said Levy May for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the

Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Farmer which

he the said Levy May now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and

informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said Levy May shall also find and allow unto the said

Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparell, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said

Levy May shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said Abraham Vance Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the

Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Abraham Vance the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid term.
