



Strickler, Bail Commissioner of the said County of Rockingham, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves indebted unto the Commonwealth of Virginia, in manner and form following, that is to say; the said Theodore Ford in the sum of Four Hundred dollars, and the said Mollie Ford in the sum of Four Hundred dollars, good and lawful money of the United States to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, and they severally waive the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia, if the said Theodore Ford shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Theodore Ford do and shall personally appear before the Circuit Court of the said County on the first day of the next term thereof which is on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1928, at the Court House thereof, and then and there answer the Commonwealth for and concerning a certain Misdemeanor by him committed, wherewith he stands charged, or to any time or times to which the proceedings may be continued or further heard, and before any Court or Judge, hereafter having or holding any proceedings in connection with the said charge, and not depart thence without leave of said Court, and be bound under this recognizance until said charge is finally disposed of or until it is declared void by order of a competent Court, then this recognizance shall be null and void, otherwise shall remain in full force and virtue.
