

This Indenture MADE THE 25th day of July

in the year of our Lord 1840 Between Jacob Rohr S^r.

one of the Overseer's of the Poor of the *First* District in the County of Rockingham of the one part, and
Daniel Byerly of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of
an Order of the County aforesaid bearing date the *25th day of July* in the year 1840 has
placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *William Clatterbaugh* of the age of *Ten*
in October next years to be an Apprentice with him the said *Daniel Byerly* and as an Apprentice
with him the said *Daniel Byerly* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said
William Clatterbaugh shall arrive, and come to the age of *Twentyone* years, according
to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said
William Clatterbaugh shall the said *Daniel Byerly*
well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *William Clatterbaugh* shall be put unto
by his said *Master* according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *William Clatterbaugh* and
the said *William Clatterbaugh* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Daniel*
Byerly and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Daniel Byerly*
And the said *Daniel Byerly* for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby
promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said
Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of *Farming & Trade of a Miller* which he the said
Daniel Byerly now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform,
or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said
Daniel Byerly shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel,
washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said
Daniel Byerly shall teach, or cause to be taught *to the S^r William Clatterbaugh*
Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *William*
Clatterbaugh the Sum of *Twenty* Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
