Dear Judge:-

I have no doubt you are kept busy about the park condemnations.

There is a tract of land located in Page County which the Board of Appraisal Commissioners reported as belonging to the estates of W. H. Fray and Cora A. Green, or rather reported that no one else was interested in the tract; while, in fact, the tract belonged to the estates of W. H. Fray, Cora A. Green and J. L. Fray. The executors and all interested parties agree that such is the case. That is, the three estates own the land jointly, each owning an undivided one-third interest.

I am enclosing you petition signed by the executors sworn to, also the order which appears to run as the other orders entered in Page County in the Park cases. The clerk sent me a copy of one of the orders so I could follow it and let there be a sameness.

You will also find enclosed certificates from the clerk and treasurer of Page County stating there are no taxes due.
