

THIS INDENTURE MADE THE 30th day of September in the year of our Lord 1832. Between John Bowman one of the Overseer of the Poor of the first District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and Archibald Hopkens of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overeer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid baring date the twentieth day of August in the year 1832 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Silas Young of the age of Ten years ~~old~~ in June ~~year~~ last to be an Apprentice with him the said Archibald Hopkens and as an Apprentice with him the said Archibald Hopkens to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said Silas Young shall arrive, and come to the age of Twentyone years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said Silas Young shall the said Archibald Hopkens well and faitfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Silas Young shall be put unto by his said Master according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said Silas Young and the said Silas Young honestly and obediently in all things be- have towards the said Archibald Hopkens and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Archibald Hopkens And the said Archibald Hopkens for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Farmer which he the said Archibald Hopkens now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said Archibald Hopkens shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, appearel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said Archibald Hopkens shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said Silas Young Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Silas Young the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
