Whereas, Ransom Snider of the said County, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, L.P. Souder a Justice of the said County, that Solomon Smith of the said county, within one year next prior to the making of this complaint, of the said County, on the ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ day of ~~XXXX~~ ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ 1917, in the said County, did unlawfully manufacture, give away, keep and store ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the commonwealth of Virginia.

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said Solomon Smith to answer the said complaint and to be further dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon Casper Dove, Edward Smith, Daisy Smith, Sarah N. ^{Snider}Smith, Casper Sonifrank, and S.F. Turner, Geo.W. Sonifrank, and Joseph Grady. to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.
