THIS WILL, made this the 20th day of September, 1916.

I wish my wife, Jane Blackburn Wilson, to be made sole Executrix of my estate, without bond or other legal proceedings.

First: it is my wish she pay off any indebtedness, and after this is done, all my personal effects to my wife, Jane Blackburn Wilson, and one-half of all my stocks and securities to go to my wife, Jane Blackburn Wilson, and the other one-half to be divided equally between my children, John William Wilson, Jr. and Frances Blackburn Wilson, and that Jane Blackburn Wilson, my wife, be appointed guardian without bond for the children until they should become of age (or 21 years old), at such time their portion of the estate to be turned over to them. It is understood that the infants' half are to bear all their own expenses, such as living, education, clothing, etc., and that the guardian deduct same from their estate.

I have twenty shares of stock of Gulf Smokeless Coal Company and four shares of Winding Gulf Land Company standing in my name which belong to my mother, Mrs. William Wilson. This has been signed over by me and should at once be transferred to her, as it does not belong to me or my estate.

Commonwealth $\frac{3}{4}$ Indictment for Perjury
Lemard Lilly $\frac{1}{4}$ Misdemeanor

This day came the attorney for the Commonwealth and the accused was led to the bar of the Court in the custody of the officer, and thereupon the accused, the said Lemard Lilly, in person pleaded guilty to the indictment, and ~~thereupon~~ with the consent of the attorney for the Commonwealth the Court proceeded to hear and determine the case without the intervention of a jury, and, having heard the evidence, ascertained the term of imprisonment of said Lilly in the County jail at five months and fixed his fine at the sum of three hundred dollars - Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the said Lemard Lilly be delivered into the custody of the Superintendent of the State Penitentiary to be held as a member of the State Court road force for the term of five months ^{apresaid} (less nine days to be deducted for the time spent in jail awaiting trial) and thereafter until his fine and other costs of the Commonwealth in this behalf are paid, such additional time not to exceed, however, a period of four months -

And it is ordered that the Commonwealth recover against the said Lemard Lilly the sum of three hundred dollars the fine apresaid, and its costs in this behalf.
