

Whereas Barbara Gilmore hath this day made oath  
before me Walter Davies a justice of the peace for  
this county (Rockingham) that from the threats which her  
husband Henry Gilmore has made she is afraid that he will  
kill her or do her some bodily harm <sup>and has required security of the peace of him</sup> These are therefore  
to require you forthwith to apprehend the said Gilmore &  
bring him before me or some other Justice of the peace  
for this county in order that he may give security  
for keeping the peace as well toward the said Barbara  
as toward the other citizens of the commonwealth until  
the next court to be holden for this county & there and  
then to appear and abide the judgement of said court  
given under my hand this 12<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1844

Be it remembered that on the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of August  
1811 that Henry Gilmore of this County (Rockingham)  
& John Deven came before me Walter Davies  
one of the Commonwealths Justices of the Peace  
for this County and acknowledged themselves  
indebted to the Lieutenant governor of the  
State of Virginia & his Successor in office in  
the sum of 100 Dollars each to be made of  
their respective Lands and Tenements goods  
and chattels to the use of the Common  
wealth aforesaid if he the said Henry  
Gilmore shall fail in performing the  
the condition underwritten -

The condition of the above Recognizance is  
such that if the above bound Henry Gil  
more shall personally appear at the next  
Court to be holden in and for the County of  
Rockingham aforesaid to do and receive  
what shall then and there be enjoined by  
the said Court and in the Mean Time shall  
Keep the Peace towards the Commonwealth  
and all its Citizens and Especially towards  
Barbara Gilmore his wife then the said  
Recognizance to be void or else remain in  
full Force
