Page late of the parish of _____ in the County
aforesaid saddled on the 30th day of March in
the year 1812, contriving & intending on Samuel
Cromer, then & yet being a citizen of the said
Commonwealth, to maim & disfigure, at the
parish aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, &
within the jurisdiction of this Court holden
for the County aforesaid, in & upon the said
Samuel Cromer, in the peace of God & of
the said Commonwealth, then & there being,
voluntarily, maliciously, & of purpose, did
unlawfully & feloniously make an assault, &
the said James G. Page, with the teeth of the
said James G. Page the ear of the said
Samuel Cromer, voluntarily, maliciously &
of purpose then & there unlawfully & felon-
iously did bite off, with intention the said
Samuel Cromer, in so doing, in maimed a-
foresaid, to maim & disfigure, against the
peace & dignity of the Commonwealth, &
against the form of the statute in such
case made & provided.

And the jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further present, that the said James G. Page afterwards, to wit, on the day & year aforesaid, at the parish & in the county aforesaid, contriving & intending one Samuel Cromer then & yet being a citizen of the said Commonwealth, to maim & disfigure, at the parish aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, & within the jurisdiction of this Court holden for the County aforesaid, in & upon the said Samuel Cromer, in the peace of God & of the said Commonwealth then & there being, unlawfully did make an assault, & the said James G. Page, with the teeth of the said James G. Page, the

ear of the said Samuel Cromer did unlawfully bite off, with intention the said Samuel Cromer, in so doing in manner aforesaid, to maim & disfigure, against the peace & dignity of the Commonwealth, & contrary to the form of the statute in that case made & provided.
