At a General Court held at the Capitol
in Richmond November 14th 1816

The Commonwealth - - - - - Upon an adjourned
against Case from the Superior
George Dove - - - - - Deft Court of Law for
Rockingham County.

The Court here doth decide by the unanimous opinion
of the Judges present, That from the proceedings in this
Philip Skelly is prosecutor, and liable to pay the costs,
of the Defendant, notwithstanding he is not named at the
foot of the information, It appearing sufficiently by the
presentment and the proceedings in the cases, that he was
the person who instituted the prosecution, And that it
was too late after Verdict had been rendered in the cases
for the prosecutor to show by parole Testimony that he
was called on by the grand jury, and did not voluntarily
go before them to give them information. Which is
Ordered to be certified to the said Superior Court.

Be it remembered that on the 26th day of
April, in the year 1812, Priscac G. Baldwin,
the attorney prosecuting for the Commonwealth
in the Superior Court of said County, came
into Court, & gave the said Court to under-
stand & be informed, that a certain George
Dove, merchant, of the County aforesaid,
on the 20th day of March in the year 1812 at
the store of the said Dove in the County
aforesaid, & within the jurisdiction of the
said Court, did unlawfully, & without ha-
ving a license therefor, retail & sell spiri-
tuous liquors, to wit, wine, whiskey, cider,
beer, rum & brandy, & mixtures thereof, ^{by the half pint & quart} to
be drank at the place where sold, to wit,
at the store of the said Dove, in the
County aforesaid, contrary to the Act of
the General Assembly in that case made
& provided, & against the peace & dignity
of the Commonwealth.

This information is filed by the
order of the Court, on the presenta-
ment of the grand jury.
