in the year 1813, Priscilla G. Baldwin, the attorney
prosecuting for the Commonwealth in the Superior
or Court of said County, came into Court, & gave
the said Court to understand & be informed, that
a certain George Dove, merchant, of the County
aforesaid, on the 6th day of March in the year
1812 at the store of said Dove in the County
aforesaid, & within the jurisdiction of the said
Court, did unlawfully, & without having a
license therefor, retail & sell spirituous liquors
to wit, wine, whiskey, cider, beer, rum, & brandy
& mixtures thereof, by the half pint & pint, to
be drunk at the place where sold, to wit, at
the store of ~~the~~ said Dove, in the County
aforesaid, contrary to the act of the General
Assembly in that case made & provided,
& against the peace & dignity of the Common-
wealth.
