The said Prisoner being led to the bar in Custody of  
the jailor, and being arraigned and charged with the said felony  
pleas Not guilty, and thereupon sumary Witnesses to witness  
Dennis Lanahan, Thomas Lanahan, John Clark, Timothy O'Farrell,  
James Oliver, Peter Jenkins, John Liles, William McMahen  
Peter Harry, Martin Burckholder, & Jacob Burckholder were  
sworn and examined touching the said offence; and the said  
Prisoner being fully heard in his defense by his Counsel, the  
Court upon consideration whereof, are of the Opinion that he is  
Guilty, of the felony where with he stands charged, and for the  
same is tried in the Superior Court of Law to be holden for the  
said County, and doth order that he be remanded to the jail  
of the said Superior, there to remain until discharge by

Rockingham County to witness

To the Sheriff of said County. Whereas James Ayles of this County  
was this day committed to the jail of this County by my Warrant  
it appearing to me, that the felonious offence where with he stands  
charged ought to be examined into by the County Court; Therefore  
on behalf of the Commonwealth I require you that you  
summons at least Eight of the Justices of our said County, to meet  
at the Court house on the Eighth day of February, and there and  
there to hold a Court for the examination of the fact with which

the said James Ayles stands charged and for such other purpose
