shall personally appear ^{at the Court house on Monday the 19th Instant} before the Common Pleas
justices a fore said, for and Concerning the taking away
a certain Quantity of Lining belonging to Joshua
King, with which the said Sally Bush stands
Charged before me, and to do and receive the what
shall then and there be ordered and adjudged, and shall
not depart there without the Leave of the said Court
then this Recognizance to be void or else to remain
in full force and virtue

To the Sheriff of the Said County.

Whereas Sally Rush was this day committed
to jail by My Warrant it appearing to Me
that the felonious offence where with she stands
Charged, ^{to wit stealing 40 yards of Linen the property of William Perkins of the value of 8/12}
^{and robbery of 20 yards of Linen the property of Joshua Perkins of the value of 4/6 and 15 yards}
ought to be examined into by the County

Court, therefore on behalf of the Commonwealth
I require you that you Summons at least
Eight of the justices of our Said County to
Meet on Monday the 19th day of this month

and then and there to hold a Court
for the examination of the fact with which
the Said Sally Rush stands Charged and for
such other purposes concerning the premises as is
by Law required and directed, and that you have
then shown this Warrant given under My hand
this 13th day of August 1816
