The jurors for the body of the County afores<sup>d</sup>, upon their oaths present, that Sally Bush of the Parish of Rockingham, and in the County of Rockingham Spinster, being a person of evil name and fame, and of dishonest conversation, and a common buyer <sup>and receiver</sup> of stolen goods, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June, in the year of our Lord 1816, about the hour of ten in the night of the same day, with force and arms, at the parish afores<sup>d</sup>, in the County of Rockingham afores<sup>d</sup>, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, holder for the ~~district~~ County, eighteen yards of Hemp lining, of the value of ~~\$100~~ Fifteen dollars, of the goods and chattels of one William Jenkins, by a certain evil disposed person, to the jurors afores<sup>d</sup> as yet unknown; then lately ~~brought~~ before, feloniously stolen, also Twenty one yards of Flax lining, of the value of twenty dollars, and ~~\$100~~ Fifteen yards of Diaper lining, of the value of fifteen dollars, of the goods and chattels of one Joshua King, by a certain evil disposed person, to the jurors afores<sup>d</sup> as yet unknown, then lately before, feloniously stolen, of the same evil disposed person, unlawfully, un-justly, and for wicked gain sake, did receive and have (she the <sup>d</sup>Sally Bush well knowing the <sup>d</sup>Hemp lining, the <sup>d</sup>Flax lining, and the <sup>d</sup>Diaper lining to have been feloniously stolen) to the great damage of the <sup>d</sup>William Jenkins, and the <sup>d</sup>Joshua King, and against the form of the Act of the General Assembly in That case made and provided; and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia
