To the Constable & Keeper of the Jail in Said County

Whereas Enoch Dunn (Labourer) of Said County is now brought before me Joseph Cravens one of the Commonwealths Justices of the peace in the Said County, requiring him to find sufficient Surety: ~~for the peace~~ to be bound with him in recognizance for his personal appearance at the next Court to be holden in & for Said County and in the mean time to keep the peace towards this Commonwealth and all its Citizens and especially towards Mary Kephart (widow) in Said County. And whereas the Said Enoch Dunn hath refused & doth refuse before me to find such Sureties: There are therefore in the name of the Commonwealth to Command you the Said Constable to forthwith to, convey the Said Enoch Dunn to the Common Jail of the Said County and Deliver him to the keeper thereof. There together with this precept, And I do in the name of the Commonwealth Command you the Said keeper of the Jail to receive the said Enoch Kephart into your custody, in the Said Jail & keep them safely keep until he shall find such Sureties as aforesaid

Whereas Mary Kephart of Said County (widow) hath personally come before me Joseph Cravens a Justice of the peace in & for Said County, & hath taken a corporal oath that she, the Said Mary Kephart is afraid that Enoch Dunn of Said County (Labourer) will beat her, or do her some other bodily hurt, and therefore prayed Surety of the peace against him the Said Enoch Dunn. These are therefore on the behalf ^{and in the name} of the Commonwealth to Command you, that immediately upon the receipt hereof you bring the Said Enoch Dunn before me, to find Surety. This will for his personal appearance at the next Court to be holden for the Said County, as also for his, keeping the peace in the mean time, towards the citizens of this Commonwealth, and chiefly towards the Said Mary Kephart.

Be it remembered that on the 22nd day of August in the year 1817 personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid Enoch Dunn and John Clarke and acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to James P. Preston Esquire Governor of Virginia and his successors in office in the sum of two Hundred Dollars that is the said Enoch Dunn in the sum of one Hundred Dollars and the said John Clarke in the sum of one Hundred Dollars to be levied off their respective Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements and for the use of the common wealth to be rendered. Yet upon this Condition that if the said Enoch Dunn shall ^{keep the peace and} be of good behavior toward all the good Citizens of this common wealth and more particularly towards Mary Rephart ~~for the term of one year~~ who hath prayed surety of the peace of the said Enoch Dunn for the term of one year then this obligation to be Void else to remain in full force and Virtue.
