to Palm Mason of Rockingham County in the State of
Virginia five notes of Ten dollars each purporting to be
on the Merchants Bank of Detroit and one note of one
Dollar on the Western Bank of Virginia. ~~and~~
declaring at the same time that the said notes were
good and Current Money, and in appearing to me
that the officer with the said Jacob Fink was ~~at~~
stand charged was committed in the said County
of Rockingham. There are therefore to Command &
Require you in the name of the Commonwealth
forthwith to convey the said Jacob Fink to the said
County of Rockingham and there deliver him to some
Justice of the peace for the said County to be dealt
with as the Law directs — Given under my
hand and seal the 25th day of August 1819

Memorandum that upon the 27th day of August in the year
1819 and in the 44th year of the Commonwealth Balser
Shaver and Abraham Shaver of Rockingham County and
John Metcalf of Pendleton County came before me
George Dove one of the Commonwealths Justices of the peace
for the said county of Rockingham and each of them of his
proper person acknowledged himself indebted to James L.
Preston esquire governor or chief magistrate of the Commonwealth
of Virginia and his successors in the sum of Two hundred dollars
To be levied severally of each of their goods and chattels lands
and tenements respectively to the use of the said Commonwealth
upon condition that if each of them do personally appear before
the Commonwealths Justices of the peace for the said county
of Rockingham on the Saturday the 11th Day of September
at a court by them to be ~~then~~ to be held for the examination
of Jacob Fent and do then and there on behalf of the
said Commonwealth give such evidence as they know against
the said Jacob Fent concerning the matters wherein he stands
charged and that ~~neither~~ he nor either of them do depart
without leave of the said court, then this recognizance to be
void else to remain in full force and virtue

meet at the Courthouse on ^{Saturday} the 11th day of September next
and then and there to hold a court for the examination

then this warrant given under my hand this 24th day
