(July) and then & there to hold a court for the examination of the facts of which the said Mary Anne Seagler stands charged, & for such other purposes concerning the premises as are by law required & directed. And that you have then there this warrant

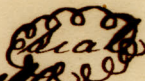

Memorandum that upon this fifth day of July in the year One thousand eight Hundred & Eighteen S^r Clear Kirtley, Benjamin Favel, James Cair, & John Huffman

----- came before me Joseph Cravens a Justice of the peace in & for Said County, and each of them of his proper person acknowledged himself indebted to James D.

Preston governor or chief Justice of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his successors in the Sum of five Hundred Dollars to be levied severally of their goods & chattels, lands & Tenements, respectively to the use of the Said Commonwealth Upon Condition that if each of them do personally appear before the Commonwealth's Justices of the peace for the Said County of Rockingham on the Eighteenth day of July Inst. at a court by them to be held, at the Courthouse of the Said county, for the examination of Mary Anne Seagler, and do then & there on behalf of the Said Commonwealth, give such evidence as he knoweth against the Said Mary Anne Seagler, concerning the matters wherewith she is charged, and that neither he, nor either of them, do depart without leave of the Said Court, Then this Recognizance to be Valid, & he to remain in

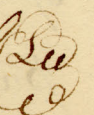
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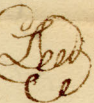

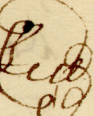

Whereas Mary Anne Seagler hath been brought before me
Joseph Cravens a Justice of the Peace for Said County, by Virtue of
a Warrant from John Hopewell Esq. a Justice of the Peace for
Hardy County, being charged on the Oath of Samuel Lewis Kirtley
of our Said County of Rockingham with feloniously Stealing and
Taking away out of his possession one Negro man Peter the
Slave of him the Said Kirtley, One Gray mare, and One pair of
Saddlebags - There are therefore to Command you the Said Constable
to convey the Said Mary Anne Seagler to the Jail of the Said
County, forthwith, and deliver her to the Keeper thereof. Who is hereby
also required to receive the Said Mary Anne Seagler and keep
her in his Said Jail & Custody, till she be thence Discharged by
due course of Law.
