Memorandum. On the 12th day of September 1818 in the year of our
lord 1818 personally appeared before me Richard P. Stutcher one of
the Commonwealth's justices of the peace for the county of Rich-
-ingham Willis Swanson saddler and Henry Welch
and David Wallace saddler.
Of the said county and acknowledge that they owe to
James P. Pulton Governor in Chief Magistrate of the Common-
wealth of Virginia namely the said Willis Swanson fifty dollars
and the said Henry Welch ^{Twenty five and the said David} ~~fifty~~ dollars, current money
Wallace twenty five dollars
to be levied of their goods & chattels, lands & tenements, to
the use of the said Commonwealth - if default is made
in performance of the conditions hereunder written
The condition of this recognizance is such that if
the above bound Willis Swanson shall personally appear
before the Commonwealth's justices of the peace, at the next court
to be held for the county of Richingham to answer to such
matter as shall then and there be objected against him con-
cerning assaulting, beating and wounding the said Lewis
Garnum gun smith of said county and concerning other mis-
-demeanors tending to a breach of the peace, and keep
the peace in the mean time towards all good people and
especially towards the said Lewis Garnum - and if he
do not depart without leave of the Court, then this recog-
nizance to be void, or else to remain in full force
and virtue
