commit by unlawfully playing at a game called cards to
with in a house ~~near~~ ^{near} Keyzelton in which a carding machine
was formerly worked by a certain Anthony Stoffman the
contrary to the Statutes in such case made & provided
same being a public place against the peace and
dignity of the common wealth and to the evil example
of all others in like case offending
