

Rockingham County to wit

Be it remembered that on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifteen Henry White Thomas Clarke John Henry John S. Herring & David Stell in the County aforesaid came before me Richard Fletcher one of the Commonwealths Justices of Peace in and for said County and acknowledged themselves to owe James P. Preston Esq<sup>r</sup> Governor of Virginia and his successors in office to wit the said Henry White the sum of One hundred Dollars and the Thomas Clarke John Henry John S. Herring and David Stell in the sum of fifty Dollars each current money of Virginia to be respectively bound and made of their several goods and chattels lands and tenements to the use of the Commonwealth aforesaid, if the said Henry White shall fail in performing the condition underneath.

The condition of this recognizance is such that whereas the above bound Henry White has this day been guilty of a breach of the peace in fighting with assaulting and beating John M. Magruder now of the said Henry White shall personally appear at the next Court to be holden in and for the County aforesaid to do and receive what shall be done and then agreed him by the said court and in the mean time shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens and especially towards John M. Magruder of the said County that the above recognizance shall be void or else remain in full force and virtue
