said Campbell where with the said Thomas stand
charged before me. you are hereby commanded
to keep the said Thomas safely in your jail
and custody without bail or mainprize, until
he shall thence be discharged by law due course
of Law given under my hand & seal this
5th of June 1819 Henry W. B.

the felonious offence wherewith he stands
charged ought to be examined into by the
County Court therefore on behalf of
the Commonwealth I require you that
you summon at least eight of the
justices of your said county to meet
at the Court House on Friday the 11th
Inst and then & then to hold a court for
the examination of the fact with which
^(which court is to consist of at least eight of said Justices)
the said Thomas stands charged, and for
such other purposes concerning the
premises as by law required and
directed and that you have then & then
this warrant given under my hand
at this 5th of June 1819
