Be it remembered that John Carthrae ^{Junr} of the Parish
of Rockingham and County aforesaid Gentlemen who for him self doth prosecute
in this behalf cometh before the Judge of the Superior Court of Land in & for
County of Rockingham assigned to keep the peace of the Commonwealth
in & for the County and also to hear and determine divers felonies trespasses
and other misdemeanors in the said County committed, at the 1st Superior
Court holden in the Court House in & for the County on ^{July} 29th day of ~~the~~
¹⁸¹⁸ in his proper person; and for him self with the Court here to understand
and be informed that George Grim late of the Parish and County aforesaid
Farmers on the 10th day of August in the year 1817 at the County aforesaid and with
the jurisdiction of this Court (being indebted to a certain John Carthrae ^{Junr} of
the Parish and County of Rockingham in the sum of twenty two dollars &
a half) did on the day and year last aforesaid at the County aforesaid and within
the jurisdiction of this Court in part payment of the debt so owing as aforesaid
by him the said George Grim to the said John Carthrae ^{Junr} offer in payment and
help and pay to the said John Carthrae ^{Junr} two ten dollar Bank notes, the same
being notes ^{emitted} by a certain unchartered banking company in the
Town of Petersburg & State of Virginia called the Western Bank of Vir-
ginia (the said Bank notes being each payable to R. L. Moore or order) against
the form of the Statutes in such case made and provided whereupon
the said John Carthrae ^{Junr} for him self prayeth the advice of the Court in
the premises and that the said George Grim may forgive the sum of two
hundred dollars according to the form of the Statutes aforesaid and that he
the said John Carthrae ^{Junr} may have the same according to the form of the Statutes
aforesaid and also that the said George Grim may come here into Court to
answer ^{concerning} the ~~above~~ premises and there are pledges of prosecuting

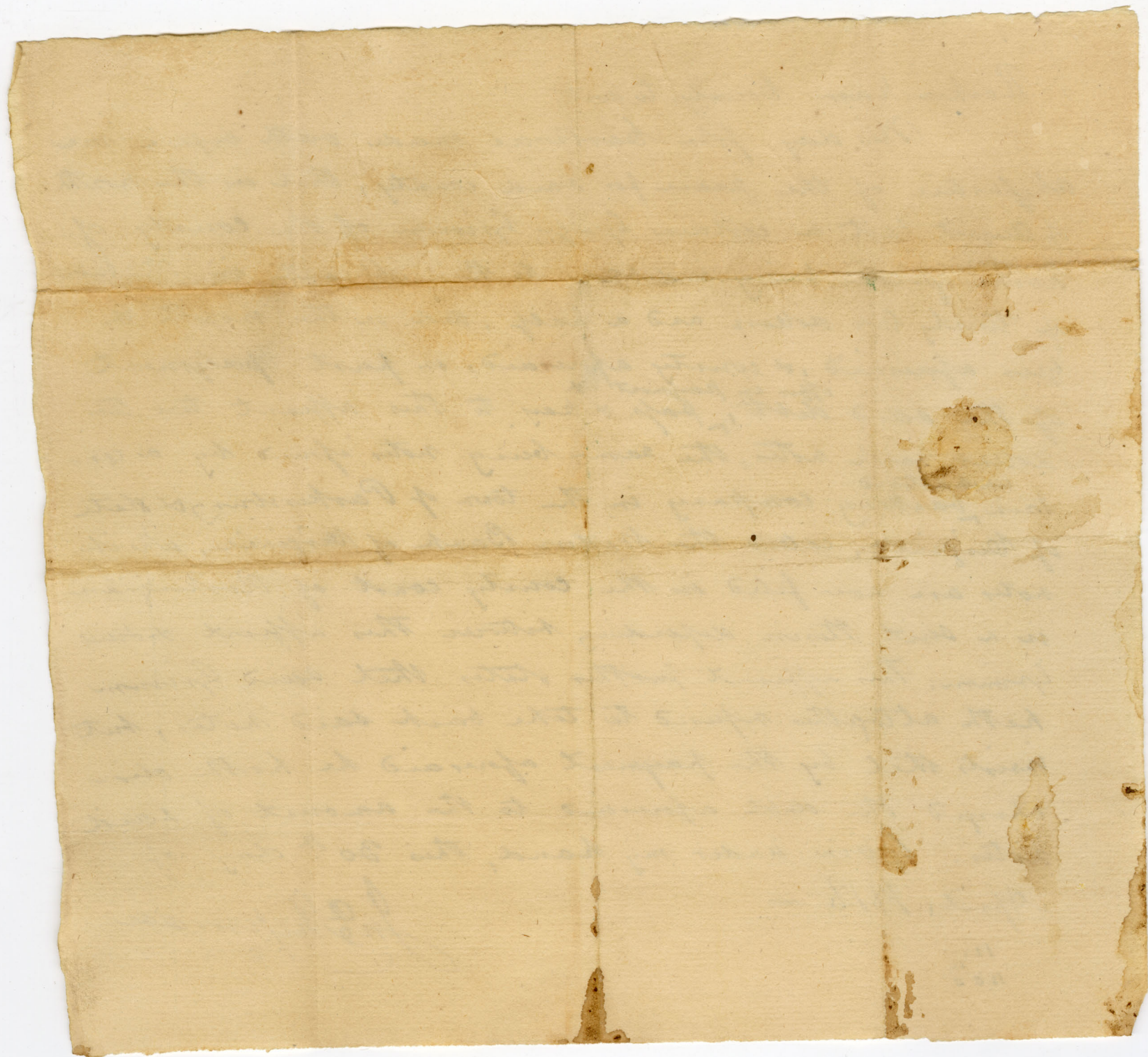

This day, John Barthrae made oath before me
a Justice of the peace for said county, that in the month
of August last a certain George Grimm of the county of
Rockingham being indebted to this affiant in the sum
of twenty two dollars and a half, did in the month &
year aforesaid, & county aforesaid, in part payment
of the said debt, ^{then in payment} pass & pay to this affiant two ten
dollar bank notes, the same being notes issued by a cer-
tain ^{unregistered} banking company in the town of Parkersburg & state
of Virginia, called the Western Bank of Virginia, which
notes are now filed in the county court of Rockingham
in a suit therein depending between this affiant & said
Grimm. This affiant further states that said Grimm
hath altogether refused to take back said notes, but
insists that by the payment aforesaid he hath dis-
charged the debt aforesaid to the amount of said

Courts in Give Information for passing unchartered notes

And it remembered that at the trial of this Information the prosecutor for the Commonwealth offered in evidence two ten dollar Bank Notes in the words & figures as follows. "The President & directors of The President & Directors Co to which the debt by her Counsel objected" alleging that the want of special description or in other words the generality of the Count forbids the introduction of the testimony aforesaid. The Court overruled the objection stating that the evidence was proper to be left to the Jury to have such weight as it deserved to which Opinion of the Court the Debt bys leave to except & prays that these her exceptions may be signed sealed and enrolled according to the act of Assembly in such case made & provided which is done accordingly
