of Rockingham labourer, on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our  
Lord 1818, at the County aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this  
Court, with force and arms, in the dwelling house of one Martin Mungar  
then situate, in & upon the said Martin Mungar in the peace of God  
and of the common wealth then & there being, feloniously did make  
an assault, and him the said Martin Mungar in bodily fear and danger  
of his life in the said dwelling house, then & there did put; and one  
Rifle gun, of the value of seven dollars, of the goods and chattels  
of the said Martin Mungar, from the person and against the  
will of the said Martin Mungar, at the dwelling house aforesaid,  
then & there violently and feloniously, did steal take, and carry  
away; against the peace and dignity of the common wealth,  
and to the evil example of all others in like case offending

September term ~~the next~~, two good and lawful men  
being freeholders of your County, residing as near as may  
be to the place where the felony was committed of  
which James Cornwall is accused each of whom is  
possessed of visible estate both real and personal of the  
value of one thousand pounds at least who are in no  
wise of kin to the said Cornwall, to recognize on their  
oaths whether the said James Cornwall be guilty of the  
felony aforesaid, or not, and this they shall in no wise  
omit, under the penalty of £100 each, and that you have  
them then the names of the Jurors aforesaid, and this  
writ, Witness My Hand & Seal Clerk of our said  
Court at the Court house thereof the 10 August  
1818 and in the 43<sup>rd</sup> Year of the Commonwealth

The Commonwealth of Virginia to the sheriff of Rocking-  
-ham county Greeting. We command you that you do not  
omit for any Liberty in your county. but that you take  
James Cornwell, late of the parish and county of Rocking-  
-ham if he be found within your bailiwicks, and him  
safely keep so that you have his body before the Judge  
of our Superior Court of law. to be holden for the said  
county on the first day of September term next, to  
answer the Commonwealth of a certain Robbery, whereof  
he stands indicted and have there there this writ  
Witness Henry J. Gambill clerk of our said Court at the  
Court house the 6<sup>th</sup> day of May 1818 and in the 42<sup>d</sup>
