year of our Lord 1818, at the County of Rockingham and within the
jurisdiction of this Court, with force and arms in the dwelling house
of one Martin Moneys then situate, in and upon the said Martin Moneys
in the peace of God and of the Commonwealth then and there being, feloniously
did make an assault, and him the said Martin Moneys in bodily fear and
danger of his life in the said dwelling house then and there did put,
and one Rifle Gun of the value of Seven dollars of the goods and
chattels of the said Martin Moneys from the person and against the
will of the said Martin Moneys, at the dwelling house aforesaid then
and there violently and feloniously did steal take and carry away
against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth, and to the
wile example of all others in like case offending
