The Grand Jury for the body of the County aforesaid on their oaths present that heretofore to witness on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1818 at the County aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this County Court Russell, Alyton a breach of the law ~~said~~ then and there did commit by unlawfully playing at a game called cards to witness at a house formerly occupied ~~used~~ as a Still house and being part of the tenement of a certain Andrew Trevey and within the curtilage of the house occupied by the said Andrew Trevey as a Tavern, the said house so formerly used as a Still-House being a public place contrary to the Statutes in such cases made and provided & other wrongs then & there did against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth and to the evil example of all ~~the~~ others in like case offending

This record went in supported by the evidence of Robert Starbuck a witness sent to the Grand Jury by the County
