Justices assigned to keep the peace within the
County to the Keeper of the Jail in the said
County Greeting

Whereas much as Richard Jackson in
the public Jail in your Custody now being
at the suit of Moses McWilliams of the County
for the want of his finding sufficient security
for his personal appearance at the next
Court to be holden in and for the County and
for his keeping the peace in the mean time
towards the Commonwealth of Virginia and
its citizens and all especially towards the said
Moses McWilliams hath found before me sufficient
security to wit John Sides hath undertaken
for the said Richard Jackson under the pain of
Three hundred dollars and he the said Richard
Jackson hath undertaken for himself under
the pain of One hundred Dollars that he the
said Richard Jackson shall and will personally
appear at the next Court to be holden in
for the County and shall well and truly keep
the peace in the mean time towards the said
Commonwealth and all the citizens thereof &
especially towards the said Moses McWilliams

Therefore on behalf of the Commonwealth
I do command you that if the said Richard
Jackson do remain in the said Jail for the said
cause and for none other, that you forbear
to grieve or detain him any longer, but that
you deliver him thence, and suffer him to
go at large, and that upon the pain that
will fall thereon Given under my hand and
Seal at Henricburg in the County this 23rd
day of November in the year 1822

It is remembered that on the 23^d day
of November in the year 1822 Richard Jackson
^{a free man of color}
of the County aforesaid (Cooper) and John Sides
came before me one of the Commonwealth's Justices
of the peace for the County aforesaid and acknow-
ledged themselves to owe to Thos^r M. Randolph
Esq^r Governor or Chief Magistrate of the Common-
wealth of Virginia and his Successors to wit
tho^s Richard Jackson the sum of One hundred
dollars and tho^s John Sides the sum of Three
hundred dollars Current Money of Virginia
to be respectively levied and made off their in-
-val Goods and Chattels Lands & Tenements to
the use of the Commonwealth aforesaid
if he tho^s Richard Jackson shall fail
in performing the Conditions underwritten

The Conditions of this Recognizance
is such that if the above named Richard Jack-
-son shall personally appear at the next
Court to be holden in and for the County
aforesaid to do and receive what shall
tho^s and then ~~be compelled~~ ^{be compelled} ~~him~~ by
tho^s Court and in the meantime
shall keep the peace towards the Com-
-monwealth and all its Citizens and espe-
-cially towards Moses McWilliams of
the County aforesaid Then the sd
Recognizance shall be void unless
then and in full force

free man of color hath personally came before me Henry
Bushnell one of the commonwealths justices assigned to keep
the peace in the said county and hath taken a corporal oath
that he the said Moses McWilliams is afraid Richard
Jackson of said county a free man of color will beat him
or do him some bodily hurt and hath therefore prayed
surety of the peace against him the said Richard Jackson

These are therefore on the behalf and in the name of the
commonwealth to command you that immediately upon the
receipt hereof you bring the said Richard Jackson before me
or some other justice of the peace for said county to find
surety as well for his personal appearance at the next
court to be holden for the said county as also for his keeping
the peace in the mean time towards the citizens of this
commonwealth, and chiefly towards the said Moses Mc
Williams
