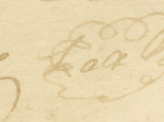


Warrington County to wit

for the purpose afore said and acknowledged themselves to be
to Thomas Rains Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his successors to wit the
said Thomas Rains bottom of the County of Warrington and
the said Miller the sum of twenty five Dollars and the said
Peter Derry the sum of twenty five Dollars in and Money of
Virginia respectively received and Made of the General
Goods and of the Lands and Tenements to the use of the
Commonwealth of Virginia if the said Thomas Rains bottom shall
fail in performing the Condition under which the above
the consideration of this Recognizance is such that the above
bount Thomas Rains bottom shall personally appear at the
next Court to be holden in and for the County of Warrington
aforesaid to answer and receive what shall therein be im-
posed him by the said Court and in the Mean time shall keep
the peace towards the Commonwealth and all its Citizens and
Especially towards David Summers in the County of Warrington the said
Recognizance shall be void or else remain in full force

Marcus David Summers in the S. County hath per-
sonally come before me and Matthew of the Comm-
monwealth assigned to keep the peace in the S. County
and hath taken a Corporal Oath that he the S. David Sum-
mers is against Thomas Bangbotten in the S. County
will beat him wound main kill or do him some bodily
hurt and therefore I have sworn Surety of the peace against him
the S. David Bangbotten these are the conditions of the Oath
and in the presence of the Commonwealth I have commanded you that
immediately you take the Receipt hereof and give it to the S. Thomas
Bangbotten before me to find Surety as above for his personal
appearance at the next Court to be holden for the S. County
as also for keeping the peace in the meantime towards
the Citizens of this Commonwealth and Chiefly towards the
said David Summers given under my hand and seal
in the S. County the 31st day of May 1822
