

At a Court held at the Court House of Rockingham County
the 8th day of June 1824 for the Trial and examination of
Jacob Cromer who was committed to the Jail of this County
on Suspicion of Forgery. On the motion of the prisoner
by his Counsel it is considered by the Court that he be let to bail
upon giving good Security for his appearance at the next Super-
ior Court to be held for this County that is to say the Said
Prisoner in the Sum of \$250. and one Security in the Sum of
\$250. or Two Securities in the Sum of \$125. each Whereupon the
Said Jacob Cromer with Christian Moyer and Doctor George
Clark his Securities appeared in Court and severally acknow-
-ledged themselves to owe and be Indebted to his Excellency
James Pleasants 1st Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia
and his Successors in office in the Sum of \$500. that is to say
the Said Jacob Cromer in the Sum of \$250. and each of the
Said Securities in the Sum of \$125. to be levied of their and
each of their respective goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements
and for the use of the Commonwealth to be rendered yet
upon this Condition that if the Said Jacob Cromer shall appear
before the Judge of the next Superior Court of Law to be held for
the Said County which will be on the Monday before the 3rd
Tuesday in October Next then and then to Answer an Indite-
-ment for the Felony of which he stands Charged and shall not
depart the Said Court untill discharged by due course of Law
then the above recognizance to be void else to remain in full
force
